



Advisory to Carolinian Students and Teachers

The primary concern of the Administration of the University of San Carlos is health and safety of everyone, including that of your families, at this crisis wrought by COVID-19 pandemic. We pray that everyone is safe. We should follow the protocol set by the government to stop the spread of the virus. Stay at home!

While you are at home for quarantine, we urge everyone to continue learning. Teachers are advised to engage with their students and check their status, including their internet connectivity. The University adopts the flexible learning modes of delivery that lead to the attainment of the course outcomes, following the principle of outcomes-based education. We trust that the Carolinian teachers will be creative in choosing the appropriate approaches in facilitating learning, taking into consideration the different situations the students are in now. The University provided you sample of online platforms, but those are not all. You can use different modes using the technology where available like email, social media, blended learning, or asynchronous learning. Teachers should consider those students who are challenged by the internet issue to submit their outputs later when the situation becomes stable. They may be given assignments that they can work on without having to go to internet cafés.

Resumption of classes will depend on the declaration of the LGU. Any learning that cannot be done outside the University, like the laboratory experiments, shall then be conducted when classes resume. Teachers must give due consideration to students who are unable to perform their learning tasks during the quarantine period due to unavailability of internet access by providing them alternative works when we all come back for classes. Teachers must submit a periodic report regarding the progress of their classes to their respective Department Chairs.

We trust our students to be responsible learners. Let us all take this quarantine as an opportunity for continuous learning.

We urge everyone to pray and lift to the Almighty all our troubles and anxieties in this time of crisis. Stay safe and continue learning at home!
